UPCOMING CENTENNIAL EVENT WILL FEATURE A "HOST" OF ALUMNI!



As a part of Catholic Central School's Centennial Year, there will be a celebration honoring the cinematic legacy of Maureen Stapleton from the Class of 1942. The Pre-Oscar event will be held on Saturday, March 9th at 2:00 pm in the Maureen Stapleton Theatre on the campus of Hudson Valley Community College. The event will be hosted by Emmy-winning film critic and 2016 Catholic Central graduate Jackson Murphy. "I am excited and honored to be hosting this event celebrating the incredible life and career of Maureen Stapleton", says Jackson. "She's an entertainment icon and a Capital Region legend, whose work has been admired for generations. This will be a great day for Stapleton, her family and Catholic Central."

Lobby displays will highlight the actress' career which spanned over 50 years and will feature items from her work on Broadway, Hollywood, and television. The program will feature a panel interview, which includes Executive Director of the Hart Cluett Museum and CCHS alumna Kathryn Knothe Sheehan, '73. When asked about her participation in the symposium, Kathy comments, "I am thrilled and honored to be a part of celebrating one of our most famous alumni! There is a little of Troy in all of Maureen's characters. She leaned heavily on her experiences growing up in a multi-ethnic neighborhood; that and her experience at Catholic Central High School brought a vibrancy and realism to every character she portrayed."

In addition, the program will include a short documentary from Maureen's son, Daniel Allentuck, along with clips from signature films. Additional contributors include Russell Sage College Theatre Professor David Baecker and Maureen Stapleton historian William G. Carey, Jr. A light dessert reception will follow the program.
