News and updates from your fellow alumni.

### Congratulations to Colonel Christine Gilhooley Rem, Class of 1967

Our very own Christine Gilhooley Rem will be honored as the Veteran of the Year for 2023 on Saturday, October 14th at 1:00 P.M. at the Saratoga-Wilton Elks Lodge #161 at 1 Elks Lane, Saratoga Springs. The event is free and open to the public. The annual award is co-sponsored by the Friends of the New York State Military Museum and the Capital District of New York Chapter of the Association of the United States Army.

Christine served for 30 years as US Army Nurse in the Active Army and US Army Reserves. She was commissioned 1LT, US Army Nurse Corps in 1982 and served the majority of her time in the US Army Reserve Hospitals in the Albany area. She served two one-year Active Duty Tours in the Wurzburg Army Hospital, Wurzburg, Germany, and from 2007-2008 deployed to Iraq for Operation Iraqi Freedom and was awarded the Bronze Star Medal. While serving, she also received her Doctor of Nursing Science degree from Sage College. She retired in March 2012. She has also been awarded the Legion of Merit, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal (4 Awards), Iraq Campaign Medal, Global War On Terror Service Medal.

After retiring from the Army, COL(Ret) Rem continued to pursue her dream of using her family home for Women Veterans and Children in Need. She founded the Capital District Women Veterans (CDWV) Program, a NYS Tax Exempt 501.c.3 Not For Profit Organization. She donated what was her maternal grandmother's house in Troy to CDWV. It opened in June 2021 and currently houses 2 women veterans. COL(Ret) Rem continues to serve as a Volunteer Case Manager for Christopher House developing and implementing the policies and procedures for this organization's growth. She works every day to enhance the lives of Veterans, Veterans Families and Veteran Caretakers in the Capital District. She is also the Chaplain for DAV Chapter 38 in Troy and is an active member of the Veteran's Peer Connection in Saratoga County, VFW of Clifton Park, the Tri County Vietnam Veterans and the American Legion Zaloga Post, Albany, NY. She currently resides in Clifton Park, NY and has 3 sons and 5 grandchildren.

Presidents of the Friends of the New York State Military Museum and the Capital District of New York Chapter of the Association of the United States Army will present the award. Saratoga County Supervisors Chairman Todd Kusnierz will present a Proclamation from Saratoga County. New York State Senators Jim Tedisco and Neil Breslin will present Proclamations from the New York State Senate. US Congressional Proclamations and flags will be presented by Congressman Tonko and remarks by the Adjutant General of the State of New York will be given.

#### Spotlight on Ray Girard, Class of 1956

Ray Girard has enjoyed a lifetime of professional and volunteer service to his country. A retired US Army veteran, Ray also retired from the Department of Defense Civil Service after 38 years of combined government service. He then served as the University of Cincinnati MBA Coordinator at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, and also was a member of the Sinclair College academic faculty, teaching Department of Defense Acquisition and Logistics. Major Girard also volunteered in the Ohio Military Reserve as the General Staff Training and Operations Officer.

For over 53 years, Ray has held numerous volunteer leadership positions in public safety and community service. For a total of 26 years, he volunteered in law enforcement, first as Officer-in-Charge of reserve police personnel for Huber Heights, and then as a Reserve Deputy Sheriff with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office.

Ray also has volunteered as a Huber Heights Fire Division Firefighter/ Paramedic, where he served as Deputy Chief for Emergency Medical Services. He also was a paramedic instructor at Good Samaritan Hospital for 11 years, and he continues his 53 years of work with HHFD, as an emergency skills community educator.

For 20 years, Ray has volunteered in Staff Officer positions for the Miami Valley Young Marines, dedicated to cultivating and leading young boys and girls towards excellence in service, character, and personal development. Ray also serves as the Honor Corridor Commander for Dayton Honor Flight. In addition, he was appointed as a Commissioner for the City of Huber Heights Military and Veterans Commission.

Throughout his Volunteer career, Ray's numerous recognitions for Volunteerism include: the Huber Heights Mortimer Award for Outstanding Citizenship; the Montgomery County Reserve Deputy Sheriff of the Year 1984; the President Bush (43) Lifetime Volunteer Service Award; the Huber Heights Key to the City; the City of Huber Heights Volunteer of the Year; the Miami Valley Young Marines Volunteer of the Year; and, in 2019 was inducted into the Young Marine Hall of Fame.

### Class of 2005


Rebecca Haight is married with three children. She lives in the Berkshires and is an accountant.
